

## BEHIND THE SCENES AT THE MUSEUM

This month, with spring clearly in the air, we thought we'd let you hear from our greenfingered gardening volunteers...

Signs of spring came to the garden early this year thanks to an unusually mild and sunny January. So mild was the weather, that hardly a week passed by all winter without one of the roses still in flower and lifting the spirits. The hellebores were the first of the spring flowers to bloom, soon

to be followed by the cheerful, welcome sight of the aconites and then, in quick succession, swathes of snowdrops.

Work in the garden continued throughout the winter with some planting and a little tidying, but in an effort to provide over-

wintering habitats for insects and larvae and create winter interest by leaving seed heads and berries throughout the garden, clearance work was kept to a minimum.

One big change that took place during the winter months was the removal of the large ash tree situated in the graveyard at the side of the Parsonage which sadly succumbed to ash tree dieback last summer. Trying to maintain a positive outlook, this will allow more light to fall on one of the shadiest parts of the garden and so bring the possibility of introducing new plants to the border which would not have flourished there before.

Looking ahead, our main focus is on endeavouring to work more sustainably wherever possible and to have wildlife and biodiversity at the forefront of our decision-making. We are looking at creating more of our own compost to use within the garden and we are also investigating the possibility of harvesting rainwater.

New planting will be carried out with the intention of attracting more bees,

> butterflies and other pollinators into the garden and a new 'bug hotel' has been created to provide a habitat for them. The hotel has been made from offcuts and recycled materials and filled with foraged materials collected on woodland walks and

so also fits in with our sustainable ethos. We are also looking at ways in which we can eliminate, or at least reduce, the use of plastics in the garden, just as we do across the rest of the Museum.

The garden is the first thing visitors see when they come to the Parsonage and always attracts positive feedback and compliments. Whatever the time of year, we hope our neighbours and local residents enjoy it too.

#### **Happy 2nd Anniversary to Worth Valley Food Bank**

Many thanks to all of you who have contributed to Worth Valley Food Bank: kind individuals, local schools, members and leaders of JOIN, churches, pubs, The

Spar, local Co-ops and traders on Main Street and Mill Hey; whose kindness throughout the last two years has enabled us to provide for the needs of vulnerable families and individuals, and their pets.

An estimated 8 million people are living in food poverty in the UK, one of the highest rates in Europe, and demand for food banks has soared during the pandemic. We are one of over 2,200 foodbanks operating in the UK, and we are making a small but vital contribution to the relief of poverty in our local community.

We don't know all the details of the stories of those who use our emergency food deliveries, but we do know that their need is genuine. On average, 12 adults, 8 children and 6 pets are in receipt each week. The provisions make a huge difference and the recipients have asked us to thank all the donors and all the volunteers, who answer the phone, shop, collect donations, mark-up. pack and deliver the bags.

delivery of food you can text or leave a message on the above number. Items regularly needed are: Long Life Milk, Tinned meat and fish, Laundry liquid, Cooking oil, Loo paper.

The English asparagus season is here, a sure sign of Spring, this is my favourite risotto and it makes one bunch of asparagus go a long way and feed four people.

If you omit the streaky bacon and use a vegetable stock rather than a chicken stock as your base, this recipe becomes vegetarian.

#### **Ingredients** (Serves 4)

I bunch of English asparagus
750ml chicken stock
75g unsalted butter
I medium onion
4 rashers of streaky bacon (unsmoked)
200g arborio rice
I 00ml dry white vermouth (or dry white wine)
I tablespoon of chopped fresh mint
I 00g Parmesan
Sea salt
Freshly ground black pepper

#### Method

The secret to making a good risotto is to have all your ingredients prepared and to hand, otherwise it can get away from you!

So, bring your stock up to a simmer, snap off the woody bits of your asparagus and chuck the woody bits into your stock. Leave to simmer for 30 minutes while you do the rest of your prep' then strain, return to a clean pan and keep warm

on a low heat at the back of your stove. Have a ladle to hand.

Chop the tips off the asparagus and blanch them in boiling salted water for a minute then drain and plunge into cold water then drain again and set aside.

Chop the remaining asparagus stalks into thickish discs on the diagonal (about 5-10 mm) and reserve, finely chop your onion and bacon rashers and finely grate your cheese.

Gently melt your 2/3 of your butter in a large saucepan and fry your onion and bacon together, stirring occasionally with a wooden spoon until the onion is soft and a pale gold colour.

Reduce the heat, tip in your rice and stir until

well mixed, now chuck in your sliced asparagus but not the tips.

Pour in your vermouth and stir till it's almost all been absorbed by the rice, now add a ladleful of your stock, stirring until it has been absorbed then add another ladleful and repeat until you've used all your stock. Add the asparagus tips when you're about 2/3 of the way down your stock. Once you've used all your stock and it has all been absorbed by the rice, remove your pan from the heat and stir in the fresh mint, the remaining butter, half your cheese and a few good grinds of black pepper, stir then check to see if it needs added salt. Cover your pot and leave for 3 minutes or so then serve onto warm plates and sprinkle over the remaining cheese.

#### SCHOOL'S OUT...

weeks, and that has given us a chance to open the Railway all week, and we've enjoyed carrying many happy passengers during the spell of good weather.

After the challenges of lockdowns and closures of the last couple of years, it's great for our volunteers to see full trains impacted by the situation, and we have running, making all our work so much more worthwhile.

Of course, running a heritage Railway continues to present challenges. The locomotives, rolling stock and infrastructure require careful - and increasingly expensive – care and maintenance, particularly with the Railway being over 150 years old, and some of our operational locomotives are now over a century old. As well as the planned maintenance and overhauls, an increasingly pressing challenge is the cost and availability of fuel.

The situation in Ukraine is appalling, and my heart goes out to all those affected. The situation has had a consequence on the Railway because it has contributed to the increase in the cost of diesel

...or at least it has been for the last two fuel (which we are all experiencing at the pumps) and it has meant that one option for the supply of coal has been shut down, which is a problem because all the coal mines and pits in the UK that produced steam coal are now closed.

> The whole heritage railway movement is been at the forefront of the work to find alternative fuels by recently being the first standard gauge (ie full size) steam railway to trial a more environmentallyfriendly fuel. More research and development is needed to refine the composition of the fuel, but we hope that this paves the way to providing options to heritage railways across the country.

Having said that, we are continuing to operate our full programme of events, and our team of 700+ volunteers look forward to welcoming you onboard soon. Even better would be if we could welcome you to our team. We are always open to new volunteers, and you can apply via the website or by calling into the office at Haworth.





#### (Don't) 'Keep On Running!' by David Hanson

Some of our more 'seasoned' readers will remember a chart-topping song from the 'Swinging Sixties' called 'Keep On Running' by the Spencer Davis Group. In fact, slightly 'less seasoned' readers will know the song as it has featured in films such as Buster and a famous Andrex puppy commercial in the 1980's. However, for those of us that get enjoyment and maintain their health and fitness from running, there is a time when you definitely have to NOT keep on running. Aches and niggles in our legs and feet are all things that we might have to tolerate as a runner. Once you've fully warmed up and get 'into the zone' those aches have eased

and are no longer an issue. But (and it's a very big and important 'but') when the pain is in one of your feet, becomes constant and gradually worsens over time to the point that it no longer is only associated with running but affects you when

you walk, it is time to take stock calcannus and investigate just where the pain is coming from.

Stress fractures of the long bones in your feet between your toes and your ankle are a cause for real concern. These bones are called your metatarsals and help form the arches of your feet which are essential in both weight bearing, walking and running. You have five metatarsal bones - your big toe is known as your first metatarsal and then moving out towards your little toe are your second, third, fourth and fifth metatarsals. Bone is a living tissue and it responds to stress by making new bone, but when the bone fails to respond adequately to stress, a stress fracture may occur. This is a hairline crack in the bone and for runners the most.

common metatarsals to develop a stress fracture are the second followed by the third. The second metatarsal is the longest and most rigid and is exposed to the greatest repetitive stresses. The fracture normally develops near the 'neck' of the bone which is closer to the toes or phalanges (see diagram). This small crack however will worsen if you continue to run and it may develop into a full thickness fracture. If this broken bone then becomes displaced, meaning that a gap forms where the bone breaks, healing becomes much more difficult and this may result in arthritis and constant pain in later life. Female athletes who have a decreased bone density as a result of changes in hormone levels that may lead to osteoprosis will be at a greater risk of developing a stress fracture of the foot. Other risk factors include poor



diet, low vitamin D levels, being under or overweight and abnormal Lateral malleolus foot anatomy such as low or Navicular bone high arches, tight Achilles Cuneiform bone tendons and weak Metatasal bones muscles.

> If you suspect you have a stress fracture in

your foot you should see your GP who will arrange for you

to have an X-ray or a bone scan. An X-ray may not show the fracture, but based on an examination of your pain and your clinical history it will still be strongly suspected. You will be advised to stop all running activities and may be placed in a supportive boot for a period of time. Healing time for a stress fracture is around 4 - 6 weeks and once the bone has fully healed you are unlikely to have any further problems and can return to running. You can still exercise in this period as long as it doesn't place further stress onto the injured foot. Static cycling, swimming and seated upper body training can all be done safely.


