WINED & DINED

A recent spell in Paris has rekindled my long enduring love affair with bread.

It has to be good bread of course but I admit to a passion for a crisp golden crust with a soft crumb, slathered with butter and eaten alongside a nice piece of pont-I-Eveque and some good olives, a seductively smooth pate or even a slick of homemade strawberry or plum jam.

French bread (like the infuriatingly stylish French woman) always seems to have the edge when it comes to style, texture and flavour. Maybe it is just that the French take their bread so seriously, the boulangerie adorns almost every French street and avenue after all, tempting the innocent passer by, beckoning one inside where the heavy scent of baking causes the stomach to groan in anticipation. Enter any French bakery and you will find yourself accosted by ranks of rustic baskets in which nestle a variety of breads all finished in high gloss golden hues, shaped in twists, plaits, slender ficelles, ring-shaped courannes and the more substantial flute. Give me a breakfast of pain au chocolat, pain au raisin and fresh baguette (not forgetting a little brioche preferably chocolate) washed down with a piping hot café au lait any day.

Closer to home the day begins for many with bread in the form of hot buttered toast. Preferences will range from thinly sliced and done to a crisp, to lightly toasted and floury, but my favourite has to be thick wedges of white toast with a generous spreading of soft butter,

the choice of conserve being dependent on my mood.

Present on the table from the start to the finish of a meal, bread has become the traditional accompaniment to many dishes, its popularity spanning different cultures the world throughout. Mediterranean loaves are often made from a compact white dough kneaded with oil: Italian focaccia for example is seasoned with olive oil and herbs. Germany produces a great many different types of bread including pretzels which are salted and scattered with cumin or poppy seeds. African breads are cooked in oil, whilst some Chinese breads are steamed. Yellow corn bread, an American. speciality, is made from cornmeal, whereas the Mexican tortilla, meaning "little cake" is a flatbread made from either corn or wheat .The Jewish bagel is a yeasted ring which is first boiled in water and then baked producing a chewy interior and a crisp exterior. The different types of bread and methods of producing it are many and varied as are the uses for the finished product. Bread is the main ingredient of sandwiches, toast croutons, some canapés, breadcrumbs and is used in the preparation of panadas, stuffings, forcemeats, timbales, charlottes, puddings and even some soups - onion soup au gratin being one example. When making your own bread, sprinkling the greased tin with rolled oats, fine oatmeal, cracked wheat or wheat bran before adding the dough will give your loaf a gorgeous nutty-flavoured crust when baked.







# Roof Care & Maintenance

#### Free Roof Surveys Will Save You Money

Many of us neglect to appreciate how important it is to maintain your home's roof in good condition. It is difficult to see, we are not roofing experts and we think it is most likely to be expensive. In truth the roof plays a vital role in keeping your house watertight and warm and should be inspected once or twice a year to ensure it continues to provide this important role.

#### How to Check Your Roof

Most checks can be done from the ground level, binoculars can be helpful, a neighbour's property may also be a useful vantage point. Inspection through the loft access trap may show daylight penetration possibly caused by missing covering or damaged flashings.

It is not advisable to attempt accessing and surveying the roof yourself as this presents many hazards. It would be recommended that a reputable and experienced roofing contractor carry this on your behalf as they would have the suitable safety equipment. A good roofing contractor would generally carry out this quotation free of charge and then recommend any necessary works.

If you check your roof as advised, preferably before the inclement weather in the winter months, you will potentially prevent water penetration causing damage within your property and save yourself money.

#### What to Look For

- Debris on the ground from broken slates, tiles or defective mortar could indicate that there may be a problem.
- If you have missing tiles or slates, have them reinstated before damage occurs to roof felt, timbers or plaster ceilings.
- Moss, leaves and other debris can block

gutters and cause the overflow of guttering which can cause damp to penetrate when running down the walls or to back

flow into the roof area.

 Moss retains moisture which may damage the roof covering, particularly if left on the roof in



frosty weather, careful removal is advisable and treatments are available to slow down reformation.

 Hips ridges and flashings can become detached in windy weather if pointing is not maintained. Look in gutters or gullies for

signs of mortar droppings.

• Leaning chimneys or pots may need attention, seek expert advice.



- Where a fuel fire is used check for smoke exiting through brickwork or at base of pots. Pointing and re-flaunching may be required.
- Many roof coverings such as lead or thatch require specialist repair. Do not use unskilled labour or quick-fix materials

as these could cause greater long-term damage and greater expense.

# TOP TECH TIPS with Michelle Thompson of Cloudfree IT

What is a strong password? And why do I need one?

(Or 'What's wrong with using my dog's name for everything?')

The number of user names and passwords we need to remember is growing fast...What a hassle! I've visited places where colleagues know each other's passwords and they've never changed. If you have yours on a little sticky note next to the computer, at home or work, it's there for anyone to see. If you've got to the point where you have a list written somewhere or have one password for everything, you may be laying yourself (or your employer) wide open to identity/data theft or even fraud. Would you tell every Tom. Dick or Harry your Bank PIN? Would you walk up to a stranger, hand them your house key and tell them to go help themselves to your family silver? Would you have just one master key to open all your doors, car and bank safety deposit box? No! No! No! Remember - 1. Passwords are the technological equivalent of keys to locked doors & 2. Criminals are inherently lazy. That's why they don't go out and get a proper job. If your passwords are 'strong', by that I mean complicated to work out, criminals will probably leave you and your bank account alone.

Some systems will force you to have a complex ('strong') password. This is a good thing - like your insurer insisting you have a 5-lever mortise deadlock

instead of a cheap night-latch. If a system doesn't have any password strength criteria set, do ask yourself if it's worth the risk in aiving it your personal information.

It'll be a while before we find fingerprint readers and retina scanners on everything from computers and cars to the fridge door (to stop the teenage midnight snackers in their tracks), so let's not make it easy for criminals in the meantime.

Look at the following guidelines and then review ALL your passwords.

- \* Minimum of 8 characters 10 or more is better and 15 characters. would probably keep cracking software busy for long enough to put a criminal off, unless you're massively rich and the delay would be worth it.
- \* Includes upper & lowercase letters and numbers
- \* Includes special characters [e.g.,?.&^%\$£"!]
- \* It's changed often (but not just by adding a digit!)
- \* NOT the name of anyone you know (e.g. you, a loved one, family member, pet or maiden name)
- \* NOT an obvious word or phrase (password cracking software uses a dictionary to look for letter combinations).

If you're thinking 'what the heck can I have?' try using a password formula to create your passwords and then remember the formula, rather than lots of passwords. Try googling 'password formula' for some suggestions.
